“DON'T GO TO SLEEP”

There are many warnings in the scriptures against sleeping when we should be awake. The Hebrew writer warned that we are to “Take heed to the things that you have heard and do not let them drift away from you” (Heb. 2:1-4). Being slack and irresponsible will cause us to perish and our lives here be virtually negated. I beg you not to drift, for it will only take a second in hell to wake you to the realities of eternity! It may be an individual Christian who has drifted off into a stupor very similar to a driver on a long trip who goes to sleep at the wheel so gradually that he is unaware of it until he has forked a big tree along the road. It could as easily be an entire congregation that has fallen to sleep and stopped producing. As family members, we often drift off while on duty in bringing our children up nourished in the Lord. That wake-up call normally does not register until our children are in trouble, then it is too late! The same neglect can destroy a marital relationship, simply due to inattentiveness. Different Bible characters were awakened; sometimes too late to change matters, but others were salvaged in the nick of time. King David heard the alarm sounded when Nathan said, “Thou art the man” (2 Sam. 12:1-14). Guilty of adultery, immorality and murder, but when awakened he confessed his sins and God forgave him. The alarm sounded for a young man eating with the pigs in a far country (Lk. 15:11-32). He demanded his inheritance, left home, and spent his money on riotous living. It was only “when he came to himself” that he was awake enough to know of the wrongness of his conduct. He returned home to present himself broken and hopeless to a forgiving and loving father. His lowly position is what enabled him to see objectively. One of the loudest wake-up calls was when the rich man found himself in torment. Too late to benefit him, but in time to help others. Though he “fared sumptuously” while on earth, he was spiritually overdrawn (Lk. 16:19-31). The bottom line is just simply “stay awake to what is right.”

LIGHT IN A WORLD OF DARKNESS

Does your light shine? In a world becoming more and more corrupted with the influence of Satan and his followers, as Christians we must shine. Our light that shines should never be one of arrogance or conceit, but rather one as a simple light would from a hill. As Christians we are in fact to let our light shine and not hide it under a basket (Matt. 5:16). The light we let shine is our influence in the world. It is the way we act, the way we dress, the way we talk, and the way we carry ourselves when we are with our peer group. Our light is the self-discipline we must have to do the right thing when no one will notice or may even know. It is doing the right thing for the right reason. It is not doing the wrong thing for the right reason, that reason being, it is a sin against God (Gen. 39:9). God knows our hearts, our secrets, and our thoughts (Ps. 44:21; 69:5, 19; 94:11; 103:14; 139:1-4). For us to shine, as God wants us to shine, our hearts, thoughts, and actions must be pure. When Moses came down from Mount Sinai after receiving the Tablets of Stone on which the Old Covenant were written, the inspired writer tells us, “*Moses did not know that the skin of his face shone while he talked with God*” (Ex. 34:29). The writer goes on to tell us that initially the people were afraid of the shiny countenance of Moses. Moses’ face shone because he had been in the presence of God. As we consider and reflect on the great blessings God continually bestows on us each and every day, do our faces show the joy and peace found in Jesus? The New Testament tells us God continues to physically bless the good and the evil with rain and sunshine (Matt. 5:45). However, it is only in Jesus one can find the true joy and peace that shine forth from us (Phil. 4:7). Thank God, for the fact we can shine in a world of darkness. Thank God for those around me whose countenance is always shining, despite the physical adversities they may be facing daily. Thank God for you. “Keep on shining.
