" Sent To Rescue "

There is a woman who has a real soft spot for animals. She not only has many animals of her own, but belongs to a rescue group-a collection of similarlyminded men and women who pool their resources (financial, organizational and otherwise) in order to adopt animals who are scheduled to be euthanized in shelters around California, and then find them good, permanent homes. This past week she adopted a puppy who was otherwise going to die, along with 30 or so other dogs at an animal shelter near Bakersfield, California. Her and her group by themselves managed to save the lives of six dogs; and along with other rescue groups around the state, a total of 19 dogs have been saved from being killed so far (and probably even more by the time this article is published). It's difficult NOT to feel compassion for animals that have been lost, and seem to be all but abandoned; animals that appear to be doomed to die. But, as the story I just related to you proves: selflessness, and kindness and love have the ability to save, don't they? Do we feel compassion for those out in the world who are lost, feel abandoned and appear destined for spiritual death? Would we act out of selflessness and kindness and love to save them? God our Father did just that for all . "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." [John 3:16]

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins." [**1 John 4:10**]

HOW MUCH DO YOU "LOVE THE BRETHREN"? by Larry Ray Hafley

Well, do you? "He that saith he is in the light, and hateth his brother, is in darkness even until now. He that loveth his brother abideth in the light" (1 Jn. 2:9, 10). "We know that we have passed from death unto life, because we love the brethren. He that loveth not his brother abideth in death" (1 Jn. 3:14). Some brethren are more loving and lovable than others. We will not feel the same emotional affection or attachment to some that we do toward others. However, we must "love (all) the brethren," for "If a man say, I love God, and hateth his brother, he is a liar; for he that loveth not his brother whom he hath seen, how can he love God whom he hath not seen" (1 Jn. 4:20)? How do we know if we "love the brethren"? "By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God, and keep his commandments" (1 Jn. 5:2). Those who "love God, and keep his commandments" do not maintain membership in man made churches, worshiping God according to the traditions and commandments of men (Matt. 15:8, 9, 13). Their devotions are "in vain," the Savior said. Their religious plant, not being planted of God, "shall be rooted up." One does not "love the brethren" when he walks contrary to the commandments of Christ. If the man referred to above truly loved the brethren, he would "love God, and keep his commandments." If he loved the brethren, he would not be endorsing a religious institution unknown to the New Testament. He would not be following human traditions that make void the word of God (Mk. 7:7, 13; 1 Jn. 5:2). Therefore, he has not "passed from death unto life." Have you passed from death to life?
