GOD'S LOVE

Love is essential for Christ's disciple. Love is a desire we awaken so that the abilities we practice and the opportunities we are presented with may be met with our actions. (Hebrews 10:23-25) Love has a power that, depending when awakened, may cause one to ascend upwards in bliss or downwards in despair. In his book, *The Road Less Traveled*, M. Scott Peck said, "I define love thus: The will to extend one's self for the purpose of nurturing one's own or another's spiritual growth." (p. 82) He continued by saying, "Love is not simply giving; it is judicious giving and judicious withholding as well. It is judicious praising and judicious criticizing. It is judicious arguing, struggling, confronting, urging, pushing and pulling in addition to comforting. It is leadership. The word 'judicious' means requiring judgment, and judgment requires more than instinct; it requires thoughtful and often painful decision making." Reflecting on Paul's tender words, an early disciple named Clement wrote this: "Love joineth us unto God; love covereth a multitude of sins; love endureth all things, is longsuffering in all things. There is nothing coarse, nothing arrogant in love. Love hath no divisions, love maketh no seditions, love doeth all things in concord. In love we're all the elect of God made perfect; without love nothing is well pleasing to God; in love the Master took us unto Himself; for the love which He had toward us.
