“FAILURE”

One of the most haunting words is that of “Failure.” No one deliberately sets out to experience it. But somewhere between youth and old age we discover not only the word, but its full meaning. “How are the mighty fallen!” Once there were twelve men. Men picked by Jesus. Men who heard Him speak. Men who saw His miracles. Men who knew He was the Christ. Men who had a mission. And with that mission came duty. To fail in duty is unthinkable. But it happened. Even in the inner-circle of the disciples of Jesus. There in the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus told Peter, James, and John, “Remain here, and watch with me.” Later he would say, “Watch and Pray.” The words are clear. The duty is plain. “Watch and pray.” But it’s one thing to know what one’s duty is, and another thing to do it. On this night so long ago, the disciples failed. They went to sleep. Sleeping sentries! One cannot watch or warn when at his post of duty, he sleeps. It is always a very grave offense if a sentry be found sleeping at his post. Often the penalty for that is death. What will Jesus do with these failures? Will he put them to death? Will he cast them off forever? Do they not deserve whatever their sentence may be? But Jesus always astonishes us. He says, “the spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak” (Matt. 26:41). Deserving death, the disciples receive understanding. **What a Savior!**

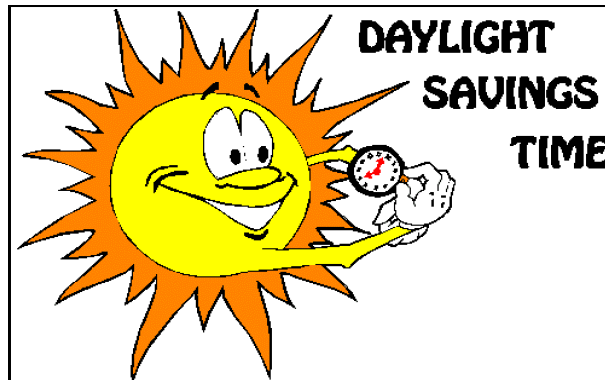
**TO KEEP

"THE FALLEN"

The Word of God address those individuals who at one time named the name of Christ, but had given up the faith. Men such as Demas who loved this world more than the Son of God, (2 Timothy 4:10.) It should be no surprise to find Christians making shipwreck of their faith since the Bible speaks of it in the first century. If you have put on Christ through baptism, but now no longer serve Him, consider what the Bible says. The apostle Paul agonized over the condition of his brethren in Galatia. They had received the gospel only to pervert it. "I am afraid for you, lest I have labored for you in vain" (Galatians 4:11). Later he writes, "You ran well, who hindered you from obeying the truth?" (Galatians 5:7). To know the way, then consciously decide to turn your back on the truth is sad because of your influence on others. You will be teaching your children, co-workers, and others that you do not love the truth enough to live it. "For if, after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, they are again entangled in them, and overcome, the latter end is worse for them than the beginning" (2 Peter 2:20). It is sad because there is nothing that I or anyone else can do for you. "For if we sin willfully after we have received the knowledge of the truth, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins," (Hebrews 10:26). It is sad for you will appear before God one day and give an account for your life, (2 Corinthians 5:10). It will then be too late to change what you had hoped to change.
