Without dreams, tomorrow is will be nothing more than a degraded copy of today. With dreams, tomorrow is just a step towards the glory of God! **Servant:** If we're going to be followers of Jesus, we better fill this job. No student is greater than his teacher, and our teacher was a servant! These are areas of ministry that can involve all. Help the church meet her needs.

"WHAT DOES IT REALLY MEAN?"

So many sales marketing agents are really good at figuring out ways to make their products and promotions look better than they really are. It's called using "Weasel Words" to say something that is technically true, but misleading. Do you know these tricks? It's called FAKE ADVERTIZING.

If they say "up to 50% off" – what does that mean? Was one item half off, but everything else was normally priced? What are they taking the discount from? The artificially inflated price? Their competitor's price? Last year's price? COULD IT BE FAKE PRICING?

If they say "Four out of five agree" – who are they talking about? You remember this line from the commercials for toothpaste, don't you? Out of seven billion people on the planet, it's not hard to find 4 who will agree. How many people did they have to ask to get "4 out of 5"? How many of those people were they paying? FAKE POLLS

If they say "Nothing is better/stronger/faster/safer" – what comparison are they forgetting? They're telling you that nobody is better than them—but is it possible that everyone is the same? They didn't tell you if anybody was worse, either! FAKE COMPARISON

You can see through these tricks and FAKE WAYS OF SAYING THINGS, But sometimes Christians tend to evaluate themselves in the same way. Have you ever heard anyone say, "I'm better than I used to be?" How about, "I may not serve as much as some people, but I serve more than others..." Lots of people like to say, "I may not be the world's best person, but I've never killed anyone..." IMAGINE THAT!

We forget that the standard of our righteousness is Jesus Christ—not the murderer down the street or the man from three decades ago. We need to evaluate our walk with God on the basis of God's messenger—Jesus the Christ, the perfect example and the one who condemned fake approaches to anything.

"BROTHERLY LOVE"

Why was brotherly love so important to Jesus? One reason is because it is the fulfilling of the law (Matthew. 22:40). This is what the Pharisees had missed in their attempt to follow the law. Jesus said, "You tithe mint and rue and all manner of herbs, and pass by justice and the love of God" (Luke 11:42). This is the same point Paul made when he finished his letter to the problem-laden Corinthian church with a treatment on spiritual gifts followed by a demonstration proving that love is superior to any other gift (1 Corinthians 12-13). Jesus knew that when the disciples failed—and fail they would—only love could bring them back. When Jesus met Peter again after he had denied Him, the Lord did not rebuke him, but simply asked, "Do you love Me?" (John 21:15-17). When Paul says that we are to "speak the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15), he did so in a discussion about maintaining unity (v 3) and edifying (v 15) the body. Furthermore, their love would demonstrate to the world that Jesus truly was from God. When Jesus died, far from sneaking back to anonymity, the disciples stood side-by-side and faced the consequences of preaching openly in Jesus' name! Their love for one another made it plain that Jesus had permanently transformed their lives in a way that only deity could. Does the world see this in us today? Does He really?
