THE RESURRECTION

NO one was more surprised at the resurrection than the disciples of Jesus. Jesus first appeared to a group of women at the open tomb, but they were not there to congratulate Jesus on the resurrection. They went to anoint the body, Luke 24:1. They were not expecting a risen savior. Then when they went and informed the apostles, the men did not believe but thought they women were telling idle tales, Luke 24: 10, 11. They were thoroughly convinced that all was lost. But oh how they would soon come to believe what they once considered to be impossible. They saw the empty tomb, they heard the voice of the savior, they saw the nail scars, they listened and finally understood the necessity of the death, burial and resurrection, Luke 24:36-49. They also came to more fully appreciate the savior's willingness to forgive their transgressions and weaknesses. Though they had doubted his words and fled when he was arrested, he still loved them. He recognized their fears and urged them to be at peace, John 20:19. **SELECTED**

HOW DO YOU RESPOND?

Is your heart right with God? Sadly, some Christians seem to have a form of godliness, but they deny its power (2 Tim. 3:5). One of the most frightening warnings of Scripture rebukes every self-satisfied Christian: "Let everyone who thinks he stands take heed lest he fall" (1 Cor 10:12). Thankfully, the Bible provides us some signs that help us know when our hearts are not where they ought to be. Consider:

We get angry with the messengers of truth often. Paul once asked his Galatians brethren, "have I therefore become your enemy because I tell you the truth?" (Gal 4:16). Stephen lost his life because of angry reaction to a much-needed sermon (cf. Acts 7:54-60). The lesson? We ought to be extremely careful how we respond when someone is trying to tell us the truth. When Christians begin to lose focus on what's important, we may well come to see those who call for Godly change as enemies. Let's not play the "victim" and unnecessarily make truth-tellers our enemies. Rather let us, "prove all things, hold fast what is good" (1 Thes. 5:21). **HOW DO YOU RESPOND?**



"WHAT HAVE THEY SEEN IN THY HOUSE"?

What makes a family truly healthy, happy, and strong? A culture filled with divorce, abuse, and dysfunctional homes demonstrates that multitudes are groping in darkness where building a strong and healthy family is concerned. Since God created the family (Gen. 2:18-25), we need to examine His word concerning how the family ought to work! Scripture teaches, "Unless the Lord builds the house, they that build it labor in vain" (Ps. 127:1). Families are an *investment* — in fact, they are among the most precious investments in life. No one on his or her deathbed wishes for more money or more time spent at the office, but often they do wish for the company of those who are closest to them. Jesus commanded His disciples to, "lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven" (Matt. 6:19-21). The time, energy, spirit, heart, and even the finances we lovingly invest in our families will not only be profitable in this life, but those investments will reap benefits in eternity as well! One of the most telling questions ever asked was, "What have they seen in your house?" (2 Kings 20:15). Has love been seen in your house lately? Have kindnesses been seen? Has Christ been seen in your house? A Christ-centered home is a place where Jesus is *evident*. A plaque in one family's home read: *Christ is the Head of this house; The silent Listener to every conversation; The unseen Guest at every meal*.
