WHERE IS GOD HAVE YOU SEEN HIM?

Has anyone ever seen God? Some passages seem to indicate "yes" but others "no." The apostle John wrote "No man hath beheld God at any time, if we love one another, God abideth in us, and His love is perfected in us" (1 John 4:12). Other passages indicate that some mortals have indeed seen God. Moses and seventy-three others saw God on Mount Sinai (Exodus 24) and later Moses saw the glory of God in part (Exodus 33). Isaiah saw the Lord (most likely in a vision (Isaiah 6). In the New Testament, as Stephen was dying from being stoned, he saw God's glory and Jesus standing at His right hand (Acts 7:56). These passages indicate that in the past, some humans have indeed seen God in some way, shape or form! Was the apostle John wrong? Does the Bible contradict itself? Or is there a reasonable explanation to what seems to be a problem? Perhaps this will help: God is by nature a spirit (John 4:24) and spirits are invisible to human eyes. But God has at times revealed Himself in the presence of humans in ways that humans can comprehend. Certain apostles and prophets saw Him in visions. But no mortal man has ever actually entered the Heavenly realms to behold God as He really is. When Phillip asked to see the Father, Jesus replied that to know the Son would be to know the Father, and he who had seen the Son had seen the Father also (John 14:7-9). We walk by faith and not by sight (2 Corinthians 5:7). Someday all will behold Him in a meeting that will be one on one, face to face! The question is, Are you ready for that?

"The Holier Than Thou— Self Righteous"

Have you ever heard someone say, "are you holier than everyone else?" The Lord judges the self-righteousness in Isa. 65 for believing themselves to be "Holier than thou". In contrast, the Apostle Paul confesses himself to be the "chief of sinners". The truth is that all men believe themselves to be one or the other. Which one we believe ourselves to be... depends on the standard by which we judge. Those who compare themselves to other men can always find someone they are 'holier' than. Those, who by God's grace have seen Christ, are brought to cry, "woe is me". The Pharisee in Luke 18 was proud of how he measured up to 'other men'. The Publican could only cry, 'Be merciful to me the sinner'! The Lord was very clear on which one went down to his house justified. Now, here is the hope of this truth. How God sees men is just the opposite of how they see themselves. God says to the 'holier than thou' group: 'you are a smoke in my nose'. And to sinners He says: "whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for His seed remaineth in him: and he cannot sin, because he is born of God." 1 Jn. 3:9. All the righteous believe themselves to be unrighteous, and all the unrighteous believe themselves to be righteous. I am thankful that God saved me from my sins many years ago and transformed me as a sinner to a Christian. I humbly accept God's love and grace and realize that I am noting without Him.

“STRAIT IS THE GATE & NARROW THE WAY”

“Enter ye in at the strait gate...Strait is the gate and narrow is the way which leadeth unto life, and few there be that find it.” “Strive to enter in at the strait gate: for many, I say unto you, will seek to enter in, and shall not be able” (Matthew 7:13; Luke 13:24) The words above were spoken by the Lord Jesus Christ. And He said in another place, “I am the way, and the truth, and the life” (John 14:6).
