SOMETHING WE CAN ALL DO

We live in a period known for a lack of personal involvement. It may be true that many people do not want to invest in the lives of others. However, we don't believe this is true of most people. When it comes to the work of the local congregation, the lack of involvement of much of the membership may come from some misconceptions.

There is the idea that all Christian service must come from organized programs of the church. This is not to downplay the importance of organization for it is still true that everyone's business often becomes nobody's business. However, there are so many good works that cannot be effectively formalized into church programs. We would like to suggest some things almost every member can do that will really make a difference.

- Be alert to visitors to all of the services. Don't become so involved with visiting the people you see all of the time that you fail to greet visitors. Introduce yourself and invite them to sit by you.
- Every congregation will have a few "loners" who do not mix well with others. Make a special effort to talk with them and make them feel noticed.
- Send a card to someone who is ill or has lost a loved one recently. Let them know that you are thinking about them.
- Write a note of appreciation to a teacher, song leader, youth worker, etc.
- Pray for the mission and benevolent work the congregation is supporting.
- Remember to pray for the elders and deacons that they might faithfully serve the congregation.
- Be alert for members who are not present and give them a call. If they are ill, let others know and offer to help in some way.

These are just a few ways that every member can serve, even if they are not a part of an organized program. There will never be a lack of good things to do if we but open our eyes to see the opportunities.

SHOULD I LEAD THE LOST TO JESUS?

I believe that personal evangelism cannot be overlooked. Personal evangelism, is seen by many as way beyond their talent and abilities. A lot of people are simply afraid, and do not deny it. Others doubt their own ability to teach and answer questions accurately. Some are not prepared to serve the Lord outside of their own piety, but entertain hopes of growing able, while others simply lack sufficient love for souls to care enough to become involved. Some cannot help in a direct way, because of infirmities that hinder their best intentions. Most likely all have good motives, but get so busy with secular life they find it terribly difficult to set aside time for ministry (Luke 8:14). Modern life is very fast paced. People are truly pressed for time. Not everyone has the same abilities; not even the same calling, but everyone has a part to play in the Lord's work, even if simply a supportive role. Without supporting actors, and a host of "extras," few movies could be made. A few handsome faces may get all the "Oscars," and those sidekicks, and faces in the crowd may go relatively unnoticed, but their contributions are nevertheless vital. The products that appear on store shelves are there, because of the anonymous labor of many support workers, each with a small role, like labeling, packaging, or shipping. High profile advertisements, and well dressed executives may be the face of these operations, but no product would reach the shelf without all the support workers. Some cannot help in a direct way, because of infirmities that hinder their best intentions. Most likely have good motives, but get so busy with secular life they find it terribly difficult to set aside time for ministry (Luke 8:14). Modern life is very fast paced. People are truly pressed for time. Not everyone has the same abilities; not even the same calling, but everyone has a part to play in the Lord's work, even if simply a supportive role. May God help us to do our part in leading the lost to Jesus.
