"THE FRAGRANCE OF CHRIST"

We all like fragrances. There are some better than others. We have five senses given by God. One of them is the sense of smell. Smell is one of the most amazing senses! Even today, when I smell certain foods, it takes me back to my mother's kitchen (especially chocolate pie). Many people dread the smell of a farm, but it's usually pleasant to me because it reminds me of our farm as a young boy. Even the smell of permanent markers and paint have reminded me of my years in school. You may have your own memories of smells from home, holidays, school, work, restaurants, nature, and other occasions. For the most part, don't you love the sense of smell? When a candle is lit the fragrance reaches to the farthest corners of the building. The Apostle Paul describes how the Christian ought to be a fragrance to the world. He says, "Now thanks be to God who always leads us in triumph in Christ, and through us diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place. 15 For we are to God the fragrance of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing. 16 To the one we are the aroma of death leading to death, and to the other the aroma of life leading to life. And who is sufficient for these things? 17 For we are not, as so many, peddling the word of God; but as of sincerity, but as from God, we speak in the sight of God in Christ." (2 Corinthians 2:14-17, NKJV) As you live your life among people of this world, are you the "aroma of Christ?" When people see the way you talk, react, think, and treat others, do they see you as one who lives triumphantly in Christ (v. 14)? DAN
