“JUST SALT”

The scientists tell us, the supply of salt in the natural world “is practically unlimited, there being an inconceivable number of pounds in the ocean alone.” The Lord Jesus said to his disciples; “Ye are the salt of the earth, but if the salt have lost his savor, wherewith shall it be salted? It is thenceforth good for nothing, but to be cast out and trodden under foot of men” (Matt. 5:13). After prolonged study, a Harvard Laboratory staff dis-covered that, although the men drank cold water freely, in the hot tempera-ture, this did not replace the salt that they had perspired out of their systems. A salt tablet with each drink of water stopped the “heat cramps.” Not only do our bodies need salt, but the manufac-turing world needs it. Steel, subjected to terrific strain in automobiles, is hard -ened by a salt water bath. The famous Carrel -Dakin antiseptic solution, which saved hundreds of thousands of lives during the World War, has as its chief ingredient chlorine, which comes from salt. Without salt cows stop giving milk and sicken and die. If salt disappeared from the earth, “the wheels of industry would eventually stop and it would be only a matter of months before we'd all be dead.” DAN

A Worm in the Fire

An Indian, when asked what the Lord had done for him, gathered some dry leaves into a circle. He placed a worm in the center of the leaves and set them on fire. As the flames drew nearer on every side and were about to consume the worm, he lifted it out and placed it on a rock. He then looked up and said, "This is what Jesus Christ did for me." In Job 25:4-6 we read, "How then can man be justified with God? or how can he be clean that is born of a woman? Behold even to the moon, and it shineth not; yea, the stars are not pure in his sight. How much less man, that is a worm? and the son of man, which is a worm?" Thus, all of us whom Job calls "worms" would have been condemned to eternal torment as the just reward for our sinful lives, if Christ had not lifted us out of our affliction.
